St. Joseph and Area Historical Society

1846. A group of seven or eight families were the first to arrive from Quebec. They arrived on a hot, humid, mid-July afternoon.

During the next few days, they staked out lots of one-half an acre or an acre and erected some crude log shanties.

A group of very dedicated and enthusiastic residents from the area have actively encouraged the research and archiving of the significant and very colourful history of the area in and around St. Joseph, Ontario. Many share family connections to their forefathers who had large dreams to make St. Joseph the transportation hub of southwestern Ontario. Together they:

- In **1997** formed the Society.
- In 1999 partnered with Millenium Canada and raised an additional \$28,000 to create the Heritage Walkway in the St. Joseph Memorial Park.
- In 2002 2003 established the St. Joseph Museum and Archives
- In 2008 created a website that includes the wonderful history of the settlement at St. Joseph - the only French settlement between Windsor and Midland.

In **2010** - **2011** the Society undertook a massive outdoor project and produced "Narcisse", a new play about St. Joseph - a live outdoor stage presentation that sold out its nine performances in July 2011 and went on to win the first Governor General's History Award for Community Programming for all of English Canada.



In **2012** the Society presented "Grave Matters" nine times over a weekend in July on the grounds of St. Peters Catholic Church. The audience was directed through the cemetery for short vignettes as local family members shared stories of their forefathers. The project was directed by Dianne Miller, with research gathered by Society members. This event was sold out too.

These families told their stories in the St. Peter's Church cemetery.

In **2013** the Society developed and presented the historically and culturally relevant production, "White Hurricane", at Hessenland Country Inn.

The 1913 storm was a blizzard with Hurricane force winds. The play brought to life the decisions to risk one last voyage; the warnings; the lives of those lost; and, the impact on our community.

The production was to run one weekend. It soon became apparent that 3 more nights and another weekend were needed.
